itchen islands provide valuable workspace, and you don't need a huge kitchen to have one. Even in smaller spaces, an island can help create that all-important working triangle between sink, fridge and stove. Layering up different work surface materials and thicknesses helps to define functional zones, and with such a broad range of materials there is no shortage of choice. Here are a few ideas to help you decide.



KITCHEN ISLANDS



Left: Reclaimed column radiators form the base of this unusual island, which is topped with quartz in concrete with a textured surface of white, grey and blue shaded areas. Price: from £440 per sqm. (geraldculliford.co.uk)

Below: This PureSteel custom-made solid stainless steel work surface is just 8mm thick with a pearl finish. It features a unique glass ceramic coating which is heat resistant up to 300°C and is made using 80 per cent recycled material. (franke.co.uk)
